It is with great pleasure that we are able to continue our mission by hosting our 9<sup>th</sup> Annual “**Par for the Clot**” Charity Golf Tournament. Currently, BDASC serves over 1,200 individuals (489 families) throughout the state, and has member families in all 46 counties. In the upstate alone, we serve 150 families, approximately over 500 individuals.

Bleeding Disorders Association of South Carolina (BDASC) is a 501(c)3 non-profit charitable organization. We are a Chapter of the National Hemophilia Foundation, A Member Organization of Hemophilia Federation of America, a member of Together SC Non-profits, and an investor in the Greenville Chamber of Commerce. BDASC serves individuals and their families in South Carolina who are diagnosed with rare, inherited genetic bleeding disorders. There are an estimated 7,000 identified rare disorders, affecting 1 in every 10 Americans. Hemophilia, von Willebrand Disease, and Factor VII Deficiency are three rare genetic blood clotting disorders in which a person is missing, or has a low or defective amount of a necessary protein factor in their blood to clot normally. Therefore, internal bleeding occurs and can cause debilitating pain and damage to joints, muscles, and can cause life threatening internal bleeding. Currently, there is no cure.

When a family or individual learns that a loved one has a rare bleeding disorder, it is heartbreaking. The picture they have painted for their family’s future, suddenly changes. Their whole world is turned upside down. It is only with the work of organizations that serve individuals with bleeding disorders like us, that families and individuals thrive, despite the often-difficult situations they must sometimes endure. **Our greatest gift we can provide to our members is helping them know they will never be alone in their bleeding disorders journey.** It is because of you, and the companies that support our mission, that we can provide a wealth of support.
